



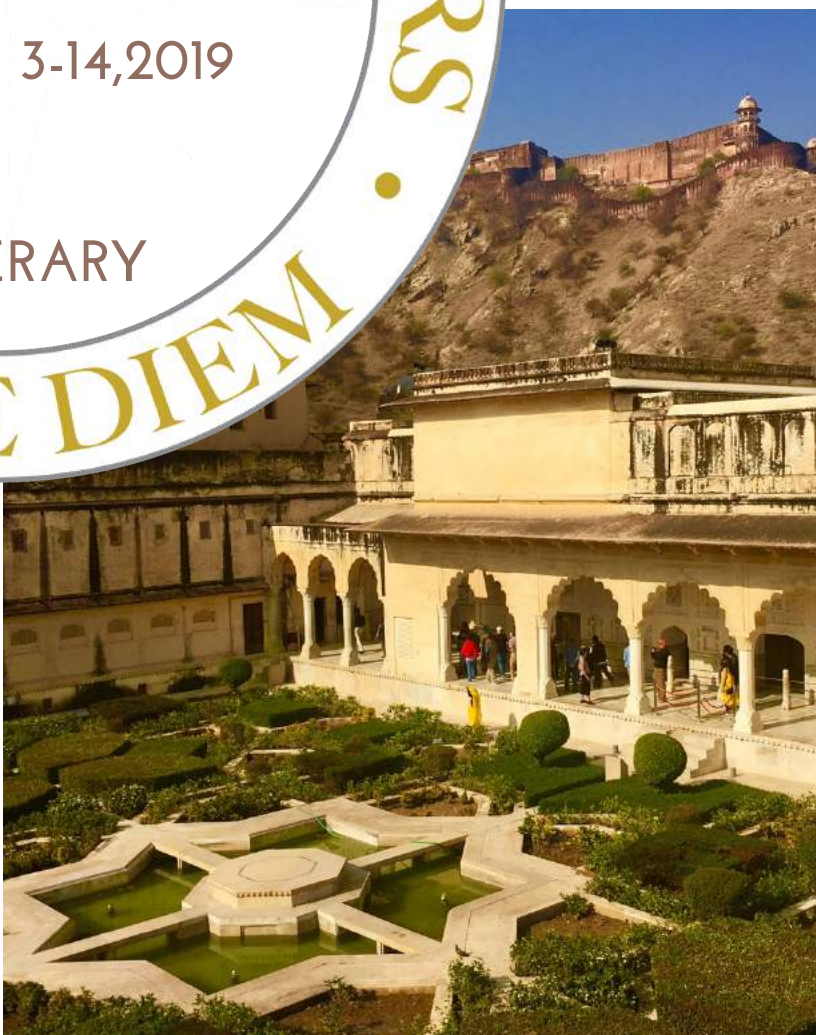

Day 1

Nov 3rd

Fly to the Delhi International
Airport, where we will greet and
transfer you to the grand Imperial
Hotel. In the evening we will gather
for dinner in the hotel's restaurant,
meet fellow guests, then settle in
for the night.



Day 2, Nov 4th

After a lavish buffet breakfast at the
hotel, we will board our private
coach for a full day of sightseeing
around Delhi, including visits to
Humayan's Tomb and Qutub Minar.

Day 3, Nov 5th

This morning we will take an
eastbound flight to Varansi, from
where we will transfer to the
Khajarahho Group of Monuments, a
group of Hindu and Jain temples in
Madhya Pradesh.
In the evening we will see a sound
and light show at the temple
complex.



Day 4, Nov 6th

In the morning we will return to Khajuraho and visit the southern and eastern group of temples. Afterward, we will drive to Jahnsi Station where we will board the Shatabdi Express train to Agra.

Day 5, Nov 7th

We depart early for a dawn visit to the Taj Mahal. Sunrise is the best time to see this iconic Indian landmark.

After the tour we will return to the hotel for breakfast.



After breakfast we depart for the Red Fort, which was the main residence of the Mughal Dynasty emperors until 1638, when the capital was shifted from Agra to Delhi.

Next we will head to Fatehpur Sikri, a walled city built by the Mughal Emperor Akbar the Great. Fatehpur Sikri is one of the best preserved examples of Mughal architecture in India.

From Fatehpur Sikri we will transfer to Bharatpur, where we will overnight at Laxmi Villas Palace.

Day 6, Nov 8th

Guests who rise early will have the option for some wildlife viewing. After breakfast we will drive to Jaipur and settle into the Trident Hotel. Guests will have the rest of the day free to relax, explore and shop in this Rhajastani city.



Day 7, Nov 9th

This day will be filled with sightseeing around Jaipur. First we will visit the Amber fort, an opulent palace constructed of red sandstone and marble, and with many notable features including the mirror palace.

From the Palace we will head into downtown Jaipur, to visit the City Palace Museum, Jantar Mantar, the Royal Observatory containing one of the world's largest sundials, and the Hawa Mahal Palace, an extraordinary pink-painted and delicately honeycombed landmark.

Day 8, Nov 10th

Guests have the morning free to spend at their leisure. In the afternoon we will fly into Aurangabad and check into the Vivanta by Taj Hotel.

Day 9, Nov 11th

Today we will tour the Ajanta Caves, a series of rock-cut Buddhist cave monuments which date from the 2nd century BCE. These incredible caves include paintings and rock cut sculptures describes as among the finest surviving examples of ancient Indian art.



Day 10, Nov 12

Today begins with a tour of the Ellora Caves, one of the largest rock-cut, monastery temple, cave complexes in the world. There are over 100 caves at the site, featuring a mix of Hindu, Buddhist and Jain artwork and monuments, and including the Kailasha temple, the largest single monolithic rock excavation in the world.

After lunch we will visit the Daultabad fort, then fly to Mumbai in the evening and settle into the Taj Mahal Hotel.

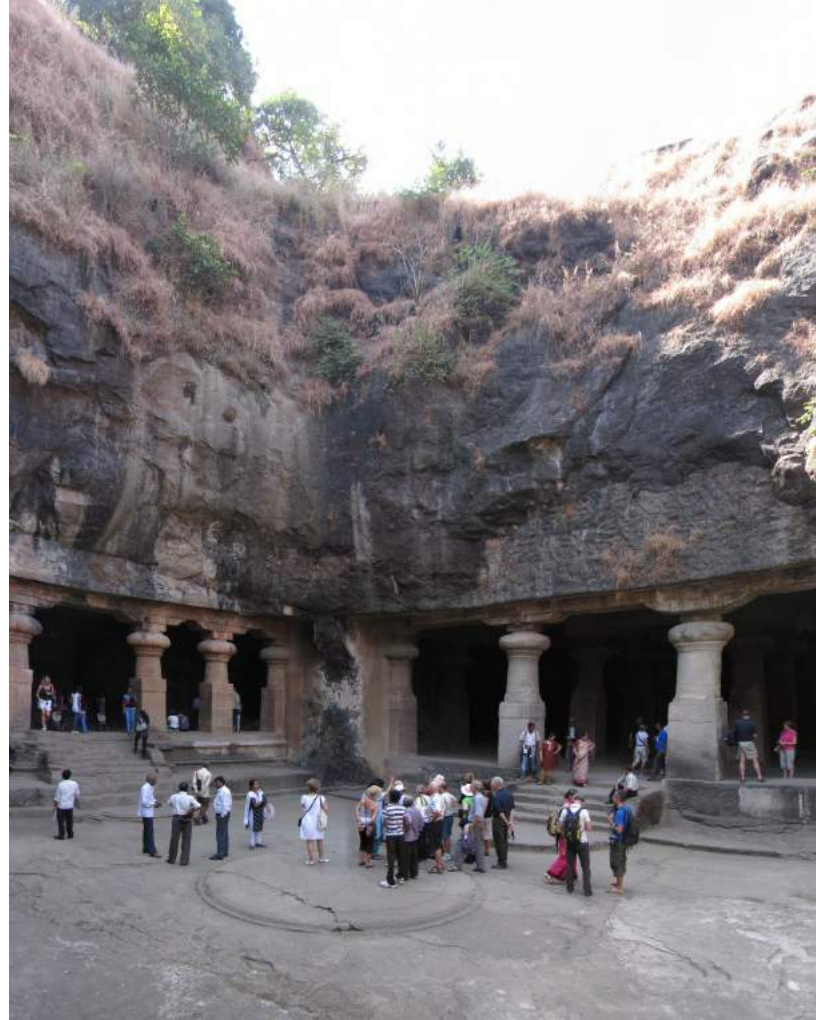


Day 11, Nov 13th

Today is filled with sightseeing around Mumbai.

We start with a visit to the Elephanta caves, a collection of cave temples predominantly dedicated to the Hindu god Shiva.

After, we will visit the Prince of Wales Museum in Mumbai, which houses 50,000 artifacts of art, archaeology and natural history. Next we head to Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus Railway Station, or more famously known as Victoria Station.



After visiting a few more highlights of Mumbai including the Afghan church, the day will conclude with a farewell dinner at our hotel.

Day 12, Nov 14th

Guests have the morning free to rest and prepare either for afternoon flights home, or to Goa where the tour will continue on the optional extension to Goa and Hampi.
